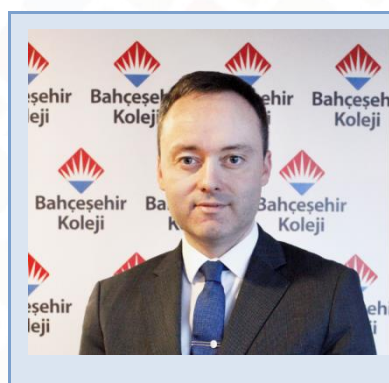

Matthew Benton is an English Language Specialist with the U.S. Department of State's English Language Programs, administered by Georgetown University. He is also CEO of Mentora Education Group and Director of Foreign Languages at Bahcesehir College, based in Istanbul. He has worked for nearly two decades in the field of language education, including positions as a teacher, curriculum developer, author and editor, department head, and senior manager. His interest in critical thinking and media literacy education comes from nearly a decade teaching the Theory of Knowledge course in the IB's Diploma Programme. He also enjoys volunteering, reading, traveling, cooking and playing guitar.

PS1: Fake News and Post-truth: Media Literacy Education for English Language Learners

In Tuzla Canton schools, students come to classes every second week, and the teachers have to present 2 units during 45 minutes. In such circumstances it is really difficult to adapt teaching materials in order to reach the learning goals. I will try to give you some practical tips on how I use tablets in my classroom to differentiate teaching super talented students, students with special needs and the rest of the class.

T3: Distance Learning Model in Montenegro - Pros and Cons

The purpose of this presentation is to provide research findings on teachers' perspectives in regard to distance learning in Montenegro during the COVID-19 pandemic with a focus on the teaching process and teachers' competencies relevant to distance learning.

This presentation is prepared using qualitative research conducted on a sample of primary school teachers and literature review. The analysis of the obtained research results showed improvement in the area of teachers' digital competencies, expressed solidarity and cooperation, as well as challenges related to increased stress level that teachers felt, their overload, and dissatisfaction with certain elements of distance learning, such as inability to adequately monitor students' learning and assess students' achievement.

In order to create an efficient modern education system great opportunities of distance learning should be used, while also efforts should be made towards overcoming weaknesses of the applied model.

T4: Empowering Students to Think Outside the Box

"By closing our schools temporary or permanently we found ourselves in a situation to become computer experts overnight and our traditional role has changed drastically: from main actors from the center of the classroom we transformed into lonely digitized images on the screen.

And what happened with our students? Where did we lose them and how should we bring them forward on the screen instead of having them behind it?

We can easily make meaningful distant teaching with the help of open pedagogy. Teachers can make an open pedagogy benefit learners and teachers alike, and precipitate creative and inclusive community in an OEP atmosphere?

This presentation aims to suggest several ideas how to engage our students work actively in online classes, the way it resembles participation in 'in-person teaching'. It will also give some hints how to make online students produce artifacts and create online material in order to make students 'language producers' not 'language consumers'.

Furthermore, it will touch on some useful instructions about online licenses you are allowed to use, reuse, distribute or share as learning sources."

W3: Visual Input in Function of Rising Awareness of Cultural Identities and Acceptance of Diversity in the EFL Classroom

The importance of visual stimuli in EFL classroom cannot be overstated since they are amongst the most powerful tools that can assist in teaching of a foreign language. They serve a variety of purposes, ranging from grabbing and maintaining attention to motivating students to develop meaningful interaction in the target language.

The purpose of this workshop is to introduce few activities that would supply visual ‘comprehensible input’ (Stephen Krashen) through which the students may learn in low anxiety situations, about other cultures and cultural identities, practice grammar points and develop critical thinking.

Note: The activities to be practiced are among those already tried in the language classroom, developed for intermediate level of language competence and some are based on sources discovered during the participation in The American English (AE) E-Teacher Program ‘Integrating Critical Thinking Skills into the Exploration of Culture in an EFL setting’ (attended from April 7, 2020 – June 2, 2020).

T11: Make it Real!

Realia are real objects in the classroom that can be a great way to help students learn English words without using the same old textbooks and exercises. They create a real connection between classroom and reality and they are also used to enhance students' awareness of target culture. Using realia in classroom is especially important for young learners since they learn best when they can see the object that represents the new word, that is when they can have direct experience through their senses because they cannot understand abstract explanations. Also, it is well known that students learn best when they are relaxed and when they learn in positive and pleasant environment avoiding boring, predictive classes based on textbooks, with unexpected objects in classroom we create interesting, innovative way of teaching that is much more memorable and they should be included in teaching English as much as possible.

Sabina Skenderovic was born in 1982 in Gradačac, Bosnia and Herzegovina. She graduated at the University of Tuzla in 2007 and completed her MA in 2013. She is currently working on her PhD thesis at the University of Tuzla. She is the founder of Center for Foreign Languages Big Ben, Tuzla which currently employs 9 teachers and has over 400 students. She has participated and held workshops at numerous international conferences for ELT professionals. In 2010 she won the second prize in Innovative Use of Technology Competition, organized by Microsoft Company and British Council. In cooperation with American Corner Tuzla and the US Embassy in Bosnia and Herzegovina, she has completed several projects. In 2019 she was selected to be one of the representatives of Bosnia and Herzegovina in an international training in Budva, Montenegro. Moreover, she was a teacher trainer at TELTs seminar funded by the US Embassy, Drama Based Institute seminar and November to Remember course for teachers, organized by Sharing One Language organization, the UK. In 2020, she received an award: Super Woman of Solidarity for her volunteer work during the pandemic. In 2021, she received an award: Person of the Year 2021 in the field of education for the assistance she provided to both public and private school teachers. She has been volunteering for 20 years and this inspired her to experiment with service learning.

PS2: Service Learning: Learning English While Contributing to the World around You
