
- 1. To help the people of interested countries in meeting their need for trained men and women.

- School-based English education
 Volunteers who serve for 2 years
- Co-teaching or model teaching with English teachers
- Professional Development workshops, conferences and resource development
- Extracurricular activities and projects
- Important! Volunteers do not replace teachers









Example Projects

MUN (Model United Nations), which gives students the opportunity to discuss global political issues, to further develop their proficiency, as well as debate and negotiation skills.

Write ON!, which promotes creative writing.

Project Design and Management Training, a three day workshop with hands-on-practice.

GLOW (Girls Leading Our World) Camp, which promotes girls' empowerment by developing leadership skills.
