

Make it simple, make it fun!

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Padlet Time!

- In this icebreaker game, the goal is to learn smth about each participant.
- Click on the link in the chat box, then you will see the Padlet Site.
- Click on the + sign in your right corner to write your name, country and one word or upload a photo which describes your personality.



Roll the dice, make a story!

- Participants are divided into groups (4-5 people)
- ▶ They take turns rolling their dice to create a story. Each participant must create a sentence based on the illustration on the faces of the dice he/she gets. Then the next participant goes.
- You can buy story cubes online. They are relatively cheap and stored in a convenient portable box which contains 9 dice and is small enough to just place it in your pocket. Anyhow, when using storydice in class, the students respond positively and create some very engaging and funny activities.





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Storytelling dice


- Participants are divided into groups (4-5 people)
- ▶ They do the *Inspired questions activity* they take turns rolling their dice. Then one participant asks a question based on the illustration on the faces of the dice he/she gets. Everyone at the table should answer the question. Then the next person takes his/her turn.





Paper Fan

- Participants work in a group (4-5 people)
- Every participant writes the answer regarding the teacher's question, folds the paper and passes it to the next member of the group. Nobody sees the others' answers.
- ▶ At the end, they fold out the paper and read the story.

Killing the Fly!

- Participants are divided into two large groups. They stand in two rows (relay race)
- The first two opponents have the fly swatter swaps and try to answer the teacher's question by **killing the fly!**








Spin the Wheel!

It is a very amusing activity for practicing tenses, but you can use it for something else, too, just click on https://wheelofnames.com/ and create your game.

Questions:

- What do you usually do at the weekend?
- What were you doing yesterday when I phoned you?
- What are you doing today?
- What did you do last week?
- What will you do tomorrow?
- What have you done recently?
- What had you done before I saw you?





The Pizza Game!

This activity can be used for all age levels, different grammar structures, recycling vocabulary and speaking.

- Brainstorm e.g. free time activities.
- Practice the target language (a few times)
- Divide Ss into small groups and let them draw a circle on a piece of paper, dividing it into eight parts (a pizza shape).
- Give your Ss a couple of minutes to write a key sentence into each slice of pizza.
- Have the Ss assign points to the eight slices of pizza.
- Each group gets a clip and bends it to use it as a marker of a slice.
- Ss have approx.10 min to spin the wheel and take turns forming sentences. The winner is the S with the highest score.
