PICTURE US activity


- 1. Show the picture to your students for 5 seconds and ask them to memorize as many things as they can.
- 2. Show the picture again, this time for 15 seconds and ask them to focus on one person who they would like to meet and ask them to explain why.
- 3. Divide students in teams, show the picture for 30 seconds and ask them to create a story based on the picture.





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GUESS THE IDIOMS activity

1. Show the picture of illustrated idioms to your students and give them one minute to guess as many idioms as they can. You can make it into a small competition.

2. During the one minute students are supposed to guess the idioms and write them correctly. The student or team that writes the most correct idioms wins.

3. After the minute is over you discuss all the idioms with the students so that everyone can hear the correct answers.

ONE-PHRASE CAMPAIGN

Brainstorm a list of well-known slogans or catchphrases used to advertise products or brands. Analyze the advertisers' use of repetition, rhyme, alliteration, and word choice. Then, direct students to create new slogans or catchphrases to promote an important concept or understanding from class.



Guess What Card activity

In this game students take turns using English to describe words on Guess What Cards.


In turn, one student describes the item with as much detail as possible, while the remaining students try to guess what the student is describing.

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


