

- 7. Learn English with compelling stories



1. Watch informative and educative videos


- Watch videos together, and discuss them afterwards
- Make sure the videos are age appropriate, educative and engaging
- Give them choices
- Integrate textbook materials with videos

#### 2. Describe pictures

- Show each student a different picture
- Let them describe the picture until the next one appears on the screen
- Make slides change automatically after 2 minutes or so





## 3. Do presentations

- Start with 5-minute presentations
- Let them choose the topic for themselves
- Give them points based on their performan

#### 4. Integrate Debate Into Your Classroom

- Introduce a topic and let students gather information and prepare at home
- Give each student the opportunity to engage in the discussion
- Give points to encourage participation

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

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
#### 6. Create Video Assignments

- Encourage students to create a video of themselves talking about a particular topic, or reflecting on a book
- Encourage them to create original content
- Evaluate the video based on accuracy, academic rigor, timing, speech rate, clarity, creativity and technical merits

Creativity and technical merits 2	


